



HARMONY FOUNDATION TRIP REPORT

Oct.11-14, 2022







From October 11th to 14th, 2022 Michael Bloomfield and Lanlin Bu from Harmony Foundation visited Canim Lake Band, Simpcw First Nation, Williams Lake First Nation, and Xatśūll First Nation. This was an excellent opportunity for the representatives in the coalition to meet with each other and staff, elders and community members.

Harmony Foundation has partnered with Canim Lake Band, Simpcw First Nation, Williams Lake First Nation, and Xatśūll First Nation to form a coalition to create the Great Caribou Rainforest Conservation Area (GCRCA) as an Indigenous-led conservation initiative. The GCRCA proposes 1,629,238 hectares of conservation land within BC's Inland Temperate Rainforest.

- Oct.11, 2022, Harmony team and the GCR Coordinator Spencer Neufeld met with Tina Donald (Fisheries & Wildlife Manager) and Paul van Velzen (Resources Group, Manager) from Simpcw First Nation.
- Oct.12, 2022, Don Dixon (Natural Resources Coordinator) from Canim Lake Band organized an open meeting with members of Canim Lake. Harmony team and Spencer Neufeld attended the meeting in person, while Nishitha Singi from Williams Lake First Nation and Emily Sonnatag from Xatsull First Nation attended online.
- Oct.13, 2022, Harmony team and Spencer Neufeld met with Mike Stinson (Councillor & Mining Coordinator), Emily Sonntag (Natural Resource Coordinator), Max Winkelman, Kelly Menakian and other staff from Xatśūll First Nation.
- Oct.13, 2022, Harmony team and Spencer Neufeld had a luncheon meeting with **Elders from Williams Lake.**
- Oct.13, 2022, Spencer Neufeld accompanied Harmony team to visit Williams Lake's office and meet with Nishitha Singi (Natural Resources/Economic Development Referrals Coordinator), John Walker (Natural Resources/Economic Development Stewardship Forester) and other staff from various departments.

PLAN AHEAD

The Coalition had a chance to map out priorities over the next few months

- Identity building: create the Coalition's website; review and approve governing documents;
- Surveys: to learn each Nation's priorities, resources, capacities and needs
- Capacity building: provide training opportunities for staff & youth, especially in indigenous-led conservation, low-carbon economy, ecosystem management
- Review existing land-use & resource management plans
- Continue engaging and urging BC & Canada
- Potential funding opportuniities for GCR's long-term development
